

### Major Projects:

The CCA has been working for several years on two major Towpath Trail Projects; resurfacing the trail from Woodman Pond Road to Route 46 and comprehensive signage along the entire Towpath and O&W Railroad trail system. CCA was successful in receiving funding for the resurfacing project from NY State and for the signage project from the Central New York Community Foundation.

In the last three years, theft of recyclable cans and bottles from barrels located at the Cottage Museum had stopped the collection program which contributed significant funds to the CCA. In response, CCA is having a secure receiver shed for recyclable deposit cans and bottles. The expectation is that the deposits will eventually pay for the shed, perhaps in one year based on past experience, and continue to add funds to the CCA on into the future. The shed will be located at the Cottage Museum.

### Towpath Trail Resurfacing:

Location: Woodman Pond Road to Route 46

Length, just under one mile

What: leveling and resurfacing the towpath Trail with a crushed stone surface, adding gates to prevent access by pickup trucks which had damaged the trail in the past and new signage, see below.

Timing: Spring/Summer 2021

### Towpath Trail Signage:

Location: The full length of the Towpath Trail and the O&W Railroad Trail, totaling 8.5 miles

What: Major information signs at trailhead, wayfinding signs at significant crossings/entrances, a birding sign at Woodman Pond, renewed QR code signs for History on the Trail audio tour, and mile markers every 1/4 mile.

Timing: May/June 2021

### CANDO Recycling Project:

What: New secure shed to collect recyclable containers for their deposits to help support the CCA budget.

Where: Next to the Cottage Museum
